Symbiotic relationship may be between soil, plant and animals associated together where all organisms get benefited and are interdependent. Nature has evolved all symbiotic relationships between organisms which became the natural resource base for sustainable plant or animal agriculture

Like people, some plants thrive surrounded by others. Companion planting is the practice of growing several types of crops near one another to enhance crop production. In general, plants with known positive relationships should be planted within two or three rows of each other.

Along with pest control, companion pairings can help in still other ways. They can provide protection and support for your main crops in the form of weed control, erosion control and water retention, shade creation, and structural support.

One ancient of symbiotic and companion agriculture is called "**Three Sisters**" which is a native American technique using beans, squash and corn. This will be addressed in a future article.
